ENSTA Bretagne's executive management team, the specialist unit established within the Social Committee (formerly H&S committee), the two disability officers (staff and students) and faculty staff all coordinate their efforts to improve student life on campus.

An Education Act which defines the conditions for applying adjustments



- The various laws applicable in the sphere of education are grouped together under the Education Act (Code de l'éducation).
- Articles D351-27 to D3516-31 define the conditions for applying special arrangements and adjustments for students with disabilities



A right to reasonable adjustments



Pursuant to Article L122-4 of Act No. 2005-102 of 11 February 2005, (as indicated below), measures tailored to your situation are taken at ENSTA Bretagne:

"To guarantee equal opportunities between candidates, provision is made by decree for adjustments for taking oral, written, practical and continuous assessments or entrance examinations to secondary and higher education establishments, required on account of a disability or a disabling health disorder. Said adjustments may particularly include the allowance of additional time and consideration during assessments, the presence of an assistant, assistive technology, provision of specialist equipment or the use, by the candidate, of their own equipment."



A bespoke welcome





- As soon as your disability had been recognized, the disability officer will get in touch with you to arrange a support appointment.
- An inclusion and adaptation plan is drawn up based on the advice of your general practitioner or local disability support center (MDPH). This lists the specific details and adjustments to be taken into account during your studies.
- These adjustments will be made during teaching and assessments
- The faculty staff are informed and the disability officer will coordinate and monitor your plan.



An accessible campus



- > All buildings on campus are accessible to people with mobility difficulties.
- > The 3 lecture theatres are equipped with an induction loop system.
- ➤ 2 wheelchair-friendly rooms are reserved (in building B on the ground floor) for people with mobility difficulties. If you are eligible to reserve one of them, please inform the manager of the student residence as soon as you make a reservation request.
